# Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> Persecuted but not forgotten Mauritania # 23<sup>rd</sup> on the Open Doors World Watch List

There are believed to be around 11,000 Christians in Mauritania, making them a tiny minority in the country, where most of its five million people are Muslim. Converting away from Islam is punishable by death. This has not happened in recent years, but the threat remains. Pray that the government of Mauritania would be open to religious freedom.

## Saturday 4th Men's Breakfast

Ask God to be with the speaker, Steve Jenkins, and with everyone present this morning, that fruitful friendships will be formed and strengthened.

# Sunday 5th

Pray for members of the PCC as they meet after church this morning for the Section 11 meeting, which will move forward the process of seeking a new vicar for Holy Trinity.

# Monday 6th

We cry out to God for the people of Gaza, particularly for the children. We pray for an unequivocal ceasefire and the resumption of adequate aid and food deliveries.

## Tuesday 7th

Pray for our Bishops, Paul and Andy, and for the process of introducing the new Diocesan Plan.

# Wednesday 8th

Pray for young people taking GCSE and A level exams this month that they will prepare well and do their best in the exam room.

## Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> Ascension Day

Praise God that Jesus went to the cross to save us from our sins, rose victoriously from the grave and ascended in glory and triumph to sit at the Father's right hand as our glorious King.

### Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> Mission Sunday Lira Projects

Pray for the aid organizations working to relieve the desperate famine affecting millions of refugees in Sudan. Pray that supplies of food will get through and be distributed.

Spirit of truth whom the world can never grasp, touch our hearts with the shock of your coming; fill us with desire for your disturbing peace; and fire us with longing to speak your uncontainable word.
