Pasta, pot noodles, tinned fruit, soup, ready meals etc. James, pickles, sugar, rice, gravy granules, cereals, packet mash,. Packet meals, biscuits, tea bags, coffee and dried milk.

Toiletries – shower gell, shampoo, roll-on deodorant, disposable razors, shaving foam, toothbrushes, toothpaste, combs and brushes.
